Looking Ahead In Real Estate and In Life

Amid real estate and stock market shifts, inflation, and the disparities of the Israel-Hamas war, some say it's been difficult lately to feel optimistic about much of anything.

But in times like these, there's strength in knowing that time will pass. All things have seasons, and in them, we can choose to be hopeful as much as we can choose to be discerning about how we use the information we gather.

Thoughts on NYC Real Estate

Although both <u>inventory and sales</u> have been down across much of 2023, we recently saw Manhattan listings increase year over year for the first time in 16 months and newly signed contracts increase year over year for the first time in 18 months. This is likely seasonal activity, but it also means a new market trend could be emerging.

In this respect, it's important to think about the value gains NYC real estate has been making. According to the latest S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Index, NYC home values <u>rose 5% year over year</u> in August, making the city one of the best-performing metropolitan areas on the index for the fourth consecutive month.

While valuation gains are promising, expenses are not. And if you haven't noticed already, some city and condo and co-op boards <u>have raised fees over</u>

50% since the first quarter of 2020 to reflect the costs of requirements like inspections, insurance, doorman salaries, and climate-friendly upgrades. Not only that, but buildings with the sharpest climbs in fees and assessments are seeing the largest declines in sales.

As far as rentals, prices have continued <u>to decline in Manhattan</u> and across the boroughs—a welcome change for those looking to lease an apartment right now. Vacancy rates are also up, and landlords have been offering more concessions than in previous months. We expect this to continue in upcoming winter months.

Thoughts on Inflation and the NYC Real Estate Market

The Federal Reserve refrained from <u>an interest rate</u> hike at their November 1 meeting, leaving the benchmark rate in the 5.25%-5.50% range. There's also speculation that the board will hold rates steady after their December meeting, but <u>that will depend</u> on the direction of inflation, the labor market, and the bond market.

In the housing market, a continued benchmark interest rate hold or drop could mean an gradual pull back of <u>mortgage rates</u>, which neared 8% in October. Fortunately, mortgage rates have come down slightly over the past few weeks based on news of the rate pause–and <u>stocks have rallied</u>. Since it's possible buyer sentiment will pick up in the midst of a higher stock market and lower mortgage rates, we could see the real estate market here in NYC improving by spring as well.

Final Thoughts

As we near the year-end holidays, it's important to stay focused on being positive, practicing gratitude, and sharing our gifts with others—whether it's a skill, monetary assistance, or a kind ear to listen when it's needed most.




